# **Operations and Services**

## **Technology**

- Bark for Schools Communicating to parents in the next two weeks with information on how to setup the Parent Portal application for Bark. This will allow parents to view and receive alerts that occur after the school day.
- Teacher Headsets Distributing to all buildings once delivered.
- **Summer and Future Planning** Started the planning process for summer and next school year so that we provide students with laptops at the start of the school year.

# **Operations and Services**

## **Nutrition**

- Providing remote meal access via bus delivery to high-need communities in addition to curbside pickup
  - 21 curbside sites
  - 1 Newark evening curbside site
  - 27 bus stop sites (11 buses in service for meals)
  - In person meal service for Cohort A&B
    - Delivery to classrooms for elementary schools
    - Grab & Go lunch for middle/high schools as students depart
- Curb & Mobile sites provide weekend meals each Friday
- Breakfast and lunch meals are provided for free through 6/30/2021

## **Facilities**

- HVAC District HVAC System Report is being updated monthly.
- At the beginning stages of upgrading/replacing the HVAC systems at several of our schools as part of ESSER II Grant funds.





# Vaccinations Ongoing

## Phase 1b (Current Phase)

Who: Persons aged 65 and older, as well as those considered frontline essential workers including: police, fire, teachers, childcare providers, food processing workers, correctional officers and postal service, public transit and grocery workers will begin to be vaccinated.

# Instructional Support

- Currently planning and executing programming to provide extra time programming for all students:
  - Working with all of our external partners to coordinate efforts towards expanding the school day/week.
  - Surveying our parents to hear their voices around the type of instructional support they desire.
  - Provide funding to pay staff to work in after school programming and tutoring.
  - Securing 250 private tutoring slots to share across our district.
  - Planning for Extended Year programming to expand the school year instead of "traditional" summer school programming.
  - Registering students for FAME and Upward Bound which include tutoring opportunities.
  - Continuing of offer office hours for families and students to connect with their teachers.

# **District Smarter Testing Update**

- State DOE has submitted a letter requesting flexibility from Smarter Balanced Testing
- Currently, we are planning to administer Smarter Testing, with no accountability.
  - Time spent on testing will be truncated to one day for each subject area.
  - If USDOE grants flexibility we may employ iReady for our assessment this year.
- PSAT/SAT/NMSQT Testing will begin in March
  - Testing is expected to be completed by April 2021
- Families can expect iReady testing to continue through this spring, for end of year assessments.

# **Special Populations Update**


- Special Services and Building Level Administration have begun to increase student's in-person learning opportunities while still maintaining the COVID safety protocols outlined by CSD, DPH and CDC guidelines
- IEP teams have begun to determine individual student need for Extended School Year-ESY and Recovery Services
- 2021 Summer School Extended School Year-ESY and Entitlement planning has begun
- Over the last few months, related service staff have resumed face-to-face evaluations while still maintaining the COVID safety protocols outlined by CSD, DPH and CDC guidelines



# Special Populations Update Cont.

- Continue meeting with the New Castle County Public School Districts in conjunction with DPH and DDoE, to discuss any updates, share processes, and troubleshoot as needed
- Nurses of special programs are supporting families of students special needs at district community testing sites in addition to the antigen testing being provided in schools. Special programs have collaborated with nurses to develop a video demonstrating the testing process
